Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian or official veterinarian of the United States, certify that the feeder calves identified on this certificate:

1. Were born in the United States;
2. Are males;
3. Are, at the time of inspection by me, not less than nine (9) days of age and not more than twenty-one (21) days of age;
4. Were inspected by me on this date and found to be free from any communicable disease and insofar as can be determined, no exposure thereto since birth;
5. Are being exported to Canada for the purpose of feeding and subsequent slaughter;

6. Are fit to travel and can be transported to Canada without undue suffering by reason of infirmity, illness, injury, fatigue or any other cause;
7. Are identified by ear tags approved by the United States Department of Agriculture and the numbers are listed on this certificate;
8. Originate in a State that:
 - a. Is designated by the United States Department of Agriculture as a Brucellosis Class Free State;
and
 - b. Is recognized by the United States Department of Agriculture as a tuberculosis accredited-free State or a modified accredited advanced State;
9. If they originate from Florida (delete if not applicable):
The feeder calves obtained a negative result for bluetongue virus infection using a cElisa test prior to export. In the case of a positive result, a PCR test with negative result was obtained.
10. All states in which the animal(s) have resided in the past twenty-one (21) days must have been free from clinical and epidemiological evidence of vesicular stomatitis during the twenty-one (21) days immediately prior to export to Canada.
11. a). The animal(s) has/have not resided in nor transited through a New World Screwworm (NWS) affected state during the twenty-one (21) days immediately prior to export to Canada.
b). After due enquiry of the exporter/shipper, the animal(s) will not reside in nor transit through a New World Screwworm (NWS) affected state from the time of certification to the time of presentation at the first port of entry into Canada.
c). The exporter/shipper has been advised that the animal(s) is/are not permitted to reside in nor transit through a New World Screwworm (NWS) affected state during the twenty-one (21) days immediately prior to export to Canada otherwise the shipment will be refused entry into Canada.
