SECTION III

I, the undersigned Veterinarian, duly authorized by the Government of Canada, do hereby certify that:

1. Canada is free from contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, ephemeral fever, foot and mouth disease, and rinderpest.
2. The donor stags have been resident in the herd of origin for the two (2) years preceding collection of the semen. Chronic wasting disease has never been diagnosed in the herd of origin.
3. The herd of origin is a herd of negative status for tuberculosis and brucellosis according to the provisions of the Cervid Movement Permit Program.

4. During the 60 days prior to collection of semen for export to the United States, the donors were examined by a veterinarian and found free from symptoms of infectious or contagious disease.

6. At the time of collection, the semen donors and teasers were clinically healthy and exhibited no clinical signs of contagious or infectious disease, including Chronic Wasting Disease.

8. The semen was collected and processed in facilities approved for this purpose by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA). Following processing, the semen has remained in the custody of the accredited veterinarian until departure.
