



DAY OLD POULTRY FROM CANADIAN HATCHING EGGS/FLOCKS CONDITIONS OF IMPORT

The birds must be certified prior to importation as follows:

The day-old poultry presented for importation originate from a flock in Canada and the shipment is accompanied by a copy of the Canadian health certificate used for entry into the United States (US) that clearly identifies the flock of origin and states that the flock was free from communicable disease before the hatching eggs were exported to the US.

The flocks were inspected by a veterinarian within thirty (30) days preceding the date of importation of the hatching eggs to the US.

To the best of the knowledge and belief of a veterinarian, the flock of origin and hatchery (where the day-old poultry hatched) are free from communicable disease and have not been exposed to avian pneumoencephalitis (Newcastle Disease), fowl plague, fowl typhoid, pullorum disease and ornithosis.

The flock of origin participated in a pullorum eradication program recognized by the veterinary officials of Canada.

The poultry are in new, clean containers, or in used containers that have been cleaned and disinfected for the purpose of preventing the introduction of diseases.

Poultry covered by this certificate do not originate from flocks nor had contact with any birds or poultry originating in a control zone established by state/provincial/Federal animal health authorities due to outbreaks of Newcastle disease or Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).
