Certification Statements:

I, the undersigned USDA Accredited Veterinarian, certify the animals described above meet the following requirements:

1. The United States is free of foot and mouth disease (FMD), rinderpest, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia (CBPP), East Coast fever (*Theileria parva*), tropical theileriosis (*Theileria annulata*), African Animal Trypanosomiasis (AAT), bluetongue serovar 8, and Rift Valley fever (RVF).
2. The United States is recognized by the World Organization for Animal Health (WOAH) as a country with controlled or negligible risk for bovine spongiform encephalitis (BSE).
3. The herd of origin has not had a clinical case of brucellosis, tuberculosis, bovine malignant catarrhal fever (MCF), Johne's disease, bovine ephemeral fever (BEF), vesicular stomatitis virus (VSV), bluetongue (BTV), anaplasmosis, babesiosis (Texas Cattle fever), leptospirosis, infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), bovine viral diarrhea/mucosal disease (BVD/MD), *Mycoplasma bovis*, enzootic bovine leukosis (EBL), *Campylobacter fetus*, *Trichomoniasis foetus*, or Q-fever for the 12 months prior to export.
4. The animals for export were isolated in a USDA-approved facility, under the supervision of a USDA Accredited Veterinarian, for at least 30 days immediately prior to export.
5. The animals for export will be inspected prior to export and only those animals found to be healthy and free from clinical evidence of communicable diseases will be approved for export.
6. During isolation, the animals for export were inspected and treated for internal parasites with a USDA approved product.

9. The cattle for export were tested at laboratories approved by APHIS during the isolation period (with the exception of tuberculosis) as noted on the chart below, for the following diseases:

- a. Tuberculosis (tested within 60 days of export): Intradermal test using bovine PPD tuberculin.
- b. Brucellosis: Complement fixation test at a 1:10 dilution; OR buffered Brucella antigen test (e.g., card test); OR ELISA; OR standard tube test; OR plate agglutination test at a 1:50 dilution.
- c. Enzootic bovine leukosis (EBL): AGID OR ELISA.
- d. Johne's disease: CFT OR ELISA OR AGID OR fecal PCR or culture OR were vaccination.

- e. Bluetongue: PCR OR VN OR Agent Identification OR ELISA.
- f. Anaplasmosis: Negative blood smear OR Agglutination card test OR IFA OR ELISA.

NOTES:

All equipment, containers, and vehicles used for transportation of animals for export shall be cleaned and disinfected with a USDA-approved disinfectant.

The accommodations provided for the animals during shipping should be designed to avoid risk of injury and unnecessary suffering, in compliance with relevant USDA regulations.

Ruminants, other animals not similar health status, and animal feed or fodder are not allowed to be taken on board the ship/aircraft after it has left the United States.

The ship/aircraft or other vehicles carrying the animals for export, may only call at approved intermediate ports after leaving the United States.

While in transit, the animals for export must not come in contact with other animals not of similar health status.

Unloading or movement of the animals may only take place under the approval and supervision of a veterinary authority of the transit country.
